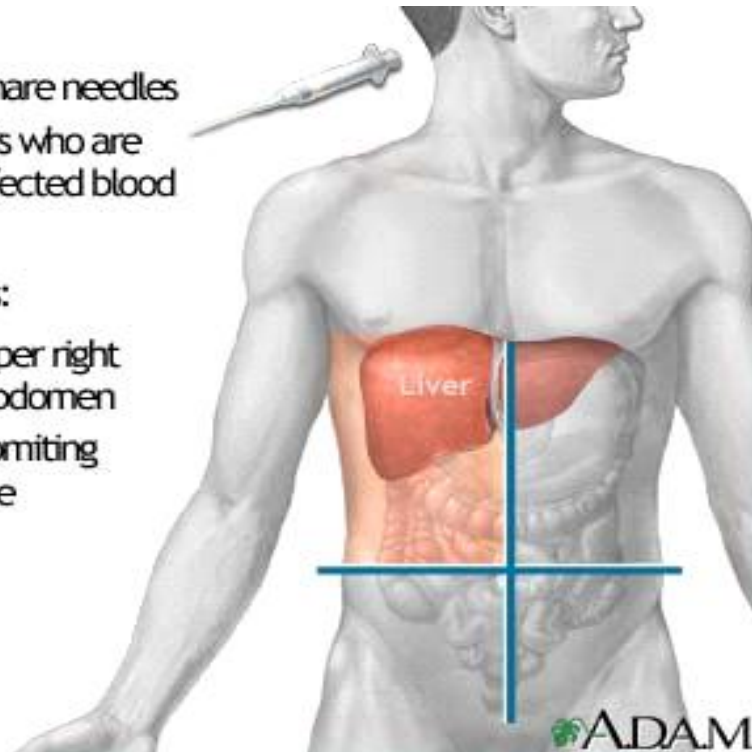
# Hep C

### Risk factors:

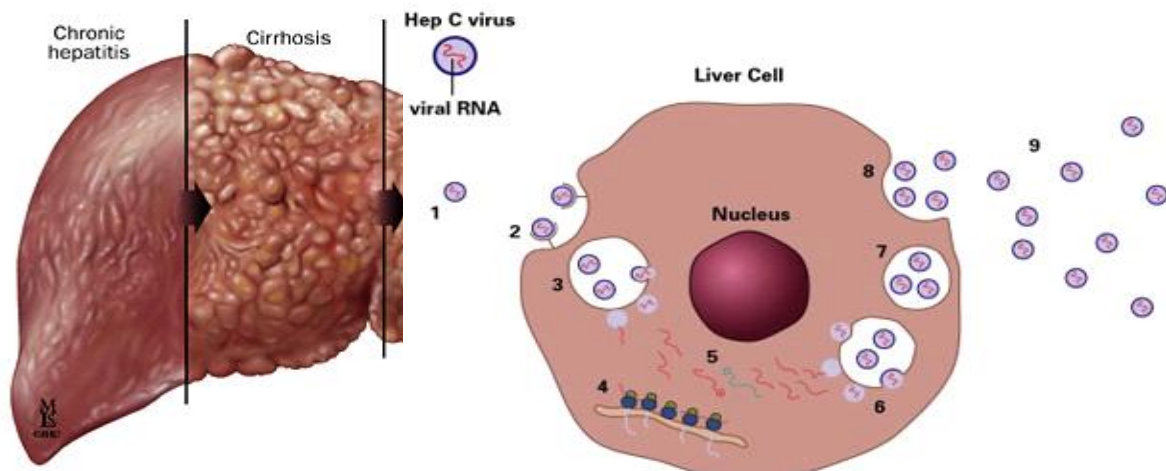
- people who share needles
